• Objective

- Can separate their love for their dog from honest evaluation of its good and bad points
- Breeding is hard work
- Every breeding is carefully planned endeavor to produce a better dog.
- Recognizes a dog's flaws and find a mate with characteristics that will help reduce or eliminate those flaws.
- Seek assistance from informational resources, longtime breeders and the breeder of their dog.
- Develop an impartial eye to test their dog against others.

Conditions the Sire and Dam

- Good puppies start long before their parents are bred
- Both sire and dam need constant care, or conditioning, to produce the best offspring.
 - Veterinary care
 - Screening for genetic problems
 - Pre-breeding health tests
 - Regular exercise
 - Good nutrition
 - Maintain dogs mental health

• Nurtures the Puppies

- Builds a proper nursery-dry, very warm and draft free.
 Big enough for the dam to move around and sides that safely contain the puppies
- Prepared for unusual but serious situations, dam with no milk, orphaned litter.
- Provides additional food and water for the dam while she is nursing the puppies
- Once the puppies are weaned, need to oversee feeding to ensure each puppy gets adequate food.
- First round of shots, may need grooming and provide plenty of playtime and opportunities for getting used to being around people.

Places Puppies Wisely

- Make sure puppies go to owners who provide loving and permanent homes.
- \circ New owners know what to expect, pros and cons
- \circ Provides paperwork to register their dogs with AKC.
- Ask questions of prospective owners in order to get a feel for the type of home they'll provide
